Appendix I : 2003-6 KISS Concertology...

"Hey, I was at that show and there were way more people than the number you state at the show!"

Yes, it's possible that there were more (or less) people at a particular show than noted here. Promoters don't always report the actual and/or correct attendance figures; Newspapers don't always get it right either; Eye-witness accounts, unfortunately, are seldom better at providing guesstimates either. So the "reported audience" numbers should be taken as being rough figures.

An important tangent: If you are looking for the ultimate tour date archive, for the years not covered here (1973-2002), then Curt Gooch and Jeff Suhs' "KISS Alive Forever: The Complete Touring History" (Billboard Books ISBN: 0-8230-8322-5) is that beast. Unequivocally! Apart from being an indispensable reference for KISS fans, it is an absolutely amazing piece of work that no KISS fan should be without! Hopefully, the authors will update their book in the future with the tour dates that have followed since publication. Until then, track down a copy anyway!

2002 Miscellaneous Appearances

February 5 – Roseland Ballroom, Manhattan, NY

Reported audience: 3,500

Set list: Shout It Out Loud / Love Gun / God Of Thunder / Lick It Up / Rock And Roll All Nite

Set notes:

- Scarily sharing the stage with Anna Nicole Smith, KISS with Ace Frehley, performed with live vocals only, at this Lane Bryant plus-size models fashion show which included some pyro and confetti. The show generated enough notice for clips of KISS to turn up on US entertainment television shows while Paul celebrated the women enthusiastically.

February 24 – Rice-Eccles Olympic Stadium, Salt Lake City, UT

Reported audience: 55,000

Set list: Rock And Roll All Nite

Set notes:

- The closing ceremony of the XIX Olympic Winter Games.
- KISS, with Ace Frehley, performed with Kristi Yamaguchi and Katrina Witt skating around the pyrotechnic blasts that engulfed the stadium. KISS, representing rock in the

American Musical Theme of the show, joined other artists including Christina Aguilera, 'N Sync, Dianne Reeves, Moby, Bon Jovi, Harry Connick Jr., Earth, Wind and Fire, Gloria Estefan, and others.

- The inclusion of KISS in the ceremony was not without some complaints. "I think a group that has been known as being satanic doesn't represent the values of Utah," said Salt Lake resident Karen Lougy. "They really weren't looking to represent most of the people of this state when they got them to play, that's for sure." Kathy Curtis echoed Lougy's sentiments. "Maybe if they did a mild performance that would be OK, but that's not likely," Curtis said. "This is really in poor taste." (Peter Thunell, Deseret News).

March 6 – Grand Lido Braco, Trelawny, Jamaica

Set notes:

- Following the band's Olympic performance Ace Frehley opted not to return to the band for further events. He was replaced with Tommy Thayer...
- There has been a tremendous amount of secrecy concerning this show at a private function.
- Several big acts were invited to play a private function in Jamaica including Nazareth and the Scorpions.
- KISS played for a small group of guests of an allegedly Russian gazzilionairre.

April 19 – Pasadena Civic Auditorium, Pasadena, CA

Attendance: <400

Set list: Detroit Rock City

Set notes:

- Filming for the Bandstand 50th Anniversary TV broadcast, which aired ABC on May 3, 2002.
- The band mimed to previously recorded music. Ace Frehley was asked to appear with the band, but was unable to do so, resulting in Tommy Thayer donning the "Spaceman" costume and makeup again.

Set notes:

- As part of promotion of the "Symphony" KISS did an interview and performed this one song with the MSO ensemble live on the Network Ten's "Rove Live" television show.
- Network Ten's studio is located in the same place that television show "Neighbours" is filmed. That Australian classic soap once featured several notable actors who became musicians: Kylie Minogue, Jason Donovan, and Craig McLachlan. Craig co-wrote material with Paul Stanley in the early 1990s, but it wasn't used and was really little more

than a glorified jam session. He recorded a cover of the Stanley/Beauvoir Voodoo X song, "A Lover Like You," for his 1992 "Hands Free" album.

February 28 – Telstra Dome, Melbourne, Australia

Reported audience: 35,000+

Set list: (***Act 1: Electric***) Deuce / Strutter / Let Me Go, Rock 'N Roll / Lick It Up / Calling Dr. Love / Psycho Circus // (***Act 2: Acoustic w/ MSO ensemble***) Beth / Forever / Goin' Blind / Sure Know Something / Shandi // (***Act 3: Symphony***) Detroit Rock City / King Of The Night Time World / Do You Love Me? / Shout It Out Loud / God Of Thunder / Love Gun / Black Diamond / I Was Made For Lovin' You / Great Expectations / Rock And Roll All Nite

Set notes:

- KISS' Symphonic show with the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra, a one night affair, would be split into three parts: First KISS would start with a short fully-electric set before being joined by a 10 piece ensemble from the MSO for a short acoustic set. Finally, KISS would be joined by the MSO, also in makeup, for the full symphonic set.
- The show was recorded for later release on Pay-Per-View and Album/DVD.
- Part of George Harrison's "Here Comes The Sun" would be played prior to "Shandi."
- The full symphonic show was introduced with a "overture from the Elder."
- The band and symphony was joined by a choir for the performance of "Great Expectations" which was making its first appearance in a KISS live set.

- Prior to doing his flying bit for "Love Gun" Paul encountered problems with one of his boots forcing him to lie down to tie it and making fun of Gene's ass and telling Tommy to talk to the crowd.

- In the confines of the limited “Rain In The Desert,” with a sold-out capacity of around 1600, the band relied on power forgoing the pyro, effects (fire-breathing or blood spitting), and solos of a “standard” KISS concert.
- No KISS logo backdrop was used with the only KISS logo being that on Peter’s bass drum.
- The band had arrived in Vegas direct from playing a show in Japan the previous night.
- Essentially, this show brought the full KISS event into the confines of what was essentially a club. “Heaven’s On Fire” would be on the set list, as the final encore, but would not be performed.
- Paul would actually address criticisms about the band’s set list during the show stating, “If you don’t like it, tough. We’re not going to do stuff most people don’t know.” Earth to Starchild...

Appendix II : 2003-6 KISS Song Performance Analysis

Stats can be pretty misleading, at the best of times, and pointless if you try and read too much into them. What is this “Song Performance Analysis?” Simply, concert-by-concert, tour-by-tour, it tracks the songs KISS performed and notes the last time such a song was performed, the first and last times the song was performed during a particular tour (or series of performances), and the number of times the song was performed during the particular tour. In essence, real KISS-nerd stuff! My apologies to my European brethren, the date formatting is US style.

Definitions:

These shouldn't be needed, but it might cause confusion for some if they weren't.

Song = The song title. Really...

Historic = The last time, prior to the detailed tour period, that the specified song was performed live...

First Play = The first date during the detailed tour period that the specified song was performed live...

Last Play = The last date during the detailed tour period that the specified song was performed live...

Times = The number of times during the detailed tour period that the specified song was performed live...

5. "Goin' Blind." On the KISSStoric document that lists the two sets from the first show "Little Lady" is not listed as part of either set sequence. Instead, it is listed off to the side with the introduction notes.
6. The band did very partially attempt "All The Way" at the KISS Konvention acoustic set in Perth, Australia on Feb. 3, 1995. The 2004 date marks the song's first full electric performance.
7. Like "All The Way," KISS first attempted "Comin' Home" acoustically at the KISS Konvention in Melbourne, Australia on Feb. 7, 1995. The song wasn't performed in its entirety until the US Konvention tour, and it has never been performed in an electric set (regardless of the debate about KISS' acoustic sets really being electric in the first place).
8. "Two Timer" was briefly attempted at the KISS Konvention in Melbourne, Australia on Feb. 7, 1995.
9. "Anything For My Baby" was briefly attempted at the KISS Konvention in San Francisco, CA on June 18, 1995.
10. Both "Shout It Out Loud" and "Flaming Youth" were first performed while the band were still on their "Alive!" tour.
11. "Baby Driver" wasn't even attempted by KISS during the Konvention tour, though Criss would perform the song during the 1990s.
12. "Mr. Speed" was partially attempted during the KISS Konvention in Adelaide, Australia on Feb. 5, 1995 and some other shows, and was first near fully performed in Phoenix, AZ.
13. "Hard Luck Woman" didn't last long in the set at the start of the "Rock And Roll Over" tour in 1976. The band tried an electric version of the song, but it didn't work. The song became a central part of the acoustic Konvention tour in 1995.
14. Even though it was on "Alive II," "Tomorrow And Tonight" was never performed live by KISS, at least in front of a paying audience, since it could have been tried out at sound-check. Recorded in the studio and over-dubbed with audience on the same day (Sharp, Ken - BtM) as "Larger Than Life."
15. "Got Love For Sale" had a single attempt on June 22, 1995 in Salt Lake City, UT. "Almost Human" was briefly attempted (twice) at the KISS Konvention in San Francisco, CA on June 18, and at some other shows.
16. "Plaster Caster" became a central part of the acoustic Konvention tour in 1995.
17. "Then She Kissed Me" was briefly attempted at the KISS Konvention in Las Vegas, NV on June 24, 1995 and at other shows.
18. All of the "Alive II" studio tracks were at least partially attempted on numerous occasions during the Konvention tour in 1995. None really made it to completion.
19. Ace made "Rocket Ride" a central part of many of his sets, and this song is perhaps one of the biggest loses to KISS' live sets 1977-80 and 1996-2001.
20. "Sure Know Something" became a mainstay during the acoustic Konvention tour in 1995.
21. Both "Magic Touch" and "Charisma" were regularly attempted, unsuccessfully, during the acoustic Konvention tour in 1995. Paul Stanley performed this song as part of his "Live To Win" set.
22. KISS tried "Torpedo Girl" out at the Brisbane Konvention on Feb. 10, 1995 and some other dates.

23. Both “The Oath” and “I,” along with “A World Without Heroes” were performed live on Friday’s TV show in January 1982. However, since then they’ve been partially attempted during the Konvention Tour, and most recently during the Australian 2004 “In Your Face” club shows – brief riffs, little more than a tease. “Just A Boy,” “Under The Rose,” and “Mr. Blackwell” were attempted at various Konvention dates, not successfully.
24. Attempted at various Konvention dates, not successfully.
25. “Keep Me Comin’” only survived for two performances.
26. “Rock And Roll Hell” only survived for three performances. It was attempted, unsuccessfully, during the Konvention tour.
27. Was attempted at the June 22, 1995 Salt Lake City, UT date and several other Konvention shows. Paul Stanley performed this song as part of his “Live To Win” set.
28. “Burn Bitch Burn” was only performed once, then dropped. It was attempted at various Konvention dates, not successfully.
29. “Get All You Can Take” was only performed once, then dropped.
30. “Any Way You Slice It” was only performed once, then dropped.
31. Performed during the Konvention tour, once famously with a little girl on lead vocals in a kind of sick and perverted way. Paul also performed the song during his 1989 solo tour.
32. “Betrayed” was only performed twice, then dropped.
33. “Hide Your Heart” had been performed live by Paul Stanley on his 1989 solo tour prior to the songs release on “Hot In The Shade.”
34. “Little Caesar” was only performed once, then dropped.
35. “Spit” was regularly performed during the 1995 Konvention tour.
36. “Every Time I Look At You” was regularly performed during the 1995 Konvention tour and was a center piece of the MTV Unplugged performance.
37. This song gets included, even though it was originally only released on the Ramones Tribute album, due to its later inclusion on the Single Disc Edition of “Alive IV – The Symphony.”
